

Programs offered at the Fluno Executive Education Center (Madison, WI)

The Fluno Center for Executive Education is a state-of-the-art facility built specifically for adult education on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus.

Robert I. Kabat Management Internship Program (MIP)

This program is comprised of three, two-week units held over six months and focuses on contemporary electric cooperative management issues. Perfect for new-to-coop CEOs, current senior leaders and those transitioning to senior leadership roles, MIP provides an in-depth look at the issues and trends impacting co-op management and the functions necessary for success. (Participants stay in the same cohort for the full six weeks.)

MIP Select: Intensive 2-week Program

Modeled after the successful MIP, this 10-day, competency-based program is designed to provide participants with tools and concepts to help them make better decisions, employ strategic thinking with a focus on leadership and implementing change.

Certified Loss Control Professional (CLCP)

The CLCP program consists of four, week-long seminars - taken in a predetermined sequence - that provide safety professionals and other co-op leaders the knowledge, skills and practical resources needed to successfully manage the safety and loss control function. Topics range from rules and regulations to communications and leadership. (Participants take sessions in order.)
