New Resources

Battery Energy Storage in Rural Utilities

The U.S. electric grid is becoming increasingly reliant on intermittent wind and solar generation, that is not dispatchable and can lead to grid challenges. Adding batteries and other storage technologies can help by

allowing a degree of dispatchability and providing a firm capacity asset for the grid when there is an unexpected drop in generation or a sudden increase in demand. This new report, published through NRECA's Outreach for Advanced Storage Integration and Support (OASIS) project, provides an overview of the applications, technologies, and economic trends of battery energy storage systems (BESS) and presents information about BESS projects deployed by rural electric cooperatives.

Update on IEEE P2030.14 Working Group for Virtual Power Plant Guide

Changes in the industry with increasing distributed energy resources (DERs) and grid complexity are resulting in greater need for flexibility. Virtual Power Plants (VPPs) can help coordinate DERs to provide important grid services. IEEE Standard P2030.14 is a Working Group to develop a Guide to help ensure that VPPs integrate DERs efficiently while maintaining the integrity of the electric grid. This new advisory reviews IEEE P2030.14, advancements made by the Working Group to date, and key considerations for electric cooperatives.

2024 National Directors Survey Results Now Available

Every other year, NRECA conducts the National Directors Survey (NDS)—a comprehensive survey of system policies and practices pertaining to cooperative governance. The NDS provides benchmark data regarding board compensation, along with board practices and policies. The survey results also include a brief section on services provided that are not "traditional" electric transmission, generation or distribution efforts, including broadband. Co-ops who participated in the survey may purchase the results for \$295. Co-ops who did not participate may purchase the results for \$995, which includes an executive summary.

"ICE" Project: Reliability Survey Opportunity

As our nation's dependence on electricity grows, providing reliable, affordable electricity has never been more challenging – and knowing the costs of outages is critical. NRECA is collaborating with Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory to survey co-op members on the costs they incur when the electricity goes out. The results of this survey will help make the case for policies, incentives, investments and technologies to maintain a reliable power supply, and help co-ops evaluate the need for additional grid investments.
