Choosing the Right Distribution Communications Options

Electric cooperatives are experiencing a rapidly evolving communications landscape, driven by advances such as Private LTE, Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellites, enhanced cellular reliability, broadband deployments, and FCC

updates on frequency sharing. These developments have expanded the range of viable connectivity options for utilities, improving performance, security, and cost-effectiveness, while adding complexity to decision-making. This new report reviews these developments and how co-ops need to carefully evaluate trade-offs in performance, cost, and long-term viability for a holistic approach to communications planning.

Survey Insights on Electric Vehicles Programs

This new report explores the impacts and opportunities presented by electric vehicles (EVs), drawing on existing research and insights from a recent survey conducted among our cooperative members and other electric cooperatives.

Resilience Planning Playbook for Electric Cooperatives

Electric cooperatives across the U.S. are navigating an evolving energy landscape as they strive to meet the surging demand for electricity and address the challenges of increased electrification, integration of distributed energy resources, and extreme weather events, all while maintaining reliability and serving their communities. Recognizing the evolving energy landscape, NRECA and the Smart Electric Power Alliance (SEPA) developed the Resilience Planning Playbook for Electric Cooperative Utilities as a resource for other electric cooperatives to navigate new approaches to resilience planning. This report includes case studies, best practices, and real-world insights from cooperative utilities developed through a workshop and several interviews.

Updated Co-op Cyber Goals Program

NRECA's Co-op Cyber Goals Program provides clear guidelines for basic security integration and actionable steps to advance your cybersecurity posture. Our cybersecurity team has just released updated reference sheets for each of the program's 20 goals, to address an ever-changing cybersecurity landscape and to allow cross-reference of goals within the program for a more comprehensive approach. These enhancements do not change the intent of the goals, and co-ops who have already completed a goal do not need to repeat it (although reviewing it on a regular basis to confirm your co-op still meets the goal and to recommit to its intent is a good exercise). We encourage all co-ops to participate in this voluntary, self-paced program, so together we can help protect co-ops and our industry grid.
