Advanced energy technologies for Distribution Automation (DA) offers strategic solution to these challenges by enabling real-time monitoring, adaptive control, and streamlined decision making across the distribution networks. NRECA's new Distribution Automation Toolkit assists co-ops in conducting cost-benefit analysis of proposed DA project technologies over the expected life of the investments. The Toolkit provides valuable insights to help NRECA members assess the value of DA projects and facilitate demonstration projects with vendors.

Utility joint use designs and clearances are crucial for ensuring the safe, reliable, and efficient operation of shared utility infrastructure. The Guide for the Application of the Clearance Requirements on Joint-Use Poles was developed by the Transmission & Distribution Engineering Committee (TDEC) Distribution Committee Overhead Work Group. It addresses safety concerns such as radio frequency (RF) exposure and NESC spacing requirements, and focuses on common RUS distribution assemblies.
