BTS Leadership Transition

Serving Large Loads

After two decades of stagnant to declining load growth, many electric cooperatives are now experiencing an unprecedented surge in electricity demand—driven in large part by the rapid expansion of large industrial and commercial loads. These emerging loads present both transformational opportunities and complex challenges. On the one hand, they offer long-term revenue potential, grid modernization investment, and local economic development. On the other, they introduce volatility, infrastructure pressure, and new expectations around reliability, interconnection, and sustainability. Serving these loads requires not only new technical capabilities, but also strategic planning, transparent rate structures, and forward-looking power supply strategies. NRECA is developing a number of new resources to assist cooperatives in understanding the evolution of large loads and

New Resources and Project Opportunities for Cooperatives

Inverter-Driven Heat Pump Load Management

Managing electric heating and cooling loads to reduce peak demand is an important task for electricity providers. Air source heat pumps (ASHP) are more efficient than other electric heating and cooling technologies, and electric utilities have encouraged adoption through incentive, education and load management programs. Advances in inverter-driven technology have led to ASHPs that can run efficiently at temperatures well below freezing, accelerating adoption in cold climates such as the Upper Midwest. This new report explores this technology advancement and highlights the experiences and lessons learned of Great River Energy cooperative.

Electric Industry Outlook Update

NRECA's Business and Technology Strategies team recently analyzed information provided by the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Energy Information Administration (EIA) to provide a high-level overview of key trends in the U.S. electric industry and how they may impact cooperatives. Our new report supplements these EIA projections with Cooperative Focus subsections specifically on electric co-ops, as well as Issue in Focus sections on two major topics impacting the industry: the growth in large commercial and industrial loads that are projected to accelerate demand for electricity, and changes in the U.S. natural gas markets that will have a major impact on the electric industry.
