

STEPS To Express Interest

To express interest in participating in the RESAP Program, contact NRECA or your Statewide Association.

NRECA encourages prospective participants to choose the latter option, as Area Administrators within statewide networks currently act as active boots on the ground (while they also coordinate RESAP Onsite Inspections at the cooperative level).

Creating a culture of safety

<u>Step 1</u>

Notify your statewide's Area Administrator to express interest in the RESAP program. If you happen not to have a statewide in your province, contact NRECA directly to speak with a safety associate.

Contact Jasmyne Montague or Ken Macken to work out those details.

<u>Step 2</u>

Your statewide's Area Administrator (or NRECA) will confirm the year your co-op's onsite observation will be scheduled. (Usually this occurs at the first available opportunity in the year at a mutually agreed upon date and will be commensurate upon the workload of the Area Administrator).

<u>Step 3</u>

Once your dashboard is live and ready, your co-op will then complete the steps in the online system in the year your onsite observation will be conducted. (Refer to the figure on the following page to view the steps in the RESAP cycle): Leadership Commitment, Safety Health Check, Annual Performance Measure, Onsite Inspection, Safety Improvement Plan.
