NRECA Broadband – Why Participate?

What is NRECA Broadband?

- NRECA Broadband supports America's electric cooperatives that are committed to bringing reliable, high-speed internet to our communities.
- Participation in this fee-for-service organization provides exclusive access to broadband-specific advocacy support, education, resources and guidance.

Co-ops entering broadband need help navigating new business issues, risks and competition.

- By 2024, there will be an estimated 350 co-ops in the broadband business, so our network has reached a critical mass.
- Co-ops face a unique set of political risks and business issues distinct from the electric business.
- Additionally, we are competing with entrenched broadband providers like Charter and AT&T that spend as much as \$40 million a year on broadband-related advocacy efforts.
- Collectively, we need to collaborate and invest more to compete as a group with these organizations.

The time is now.

- My co-op signed up for NRECA Broadband because the stakes are high, and we'll never have another chance like this to close the digital divide.
- We need a powerful, unified voice to represent our telecommunications interests in Washington. NRECA is best positioned and resourced to make an impact for us.

We need NRECA to be our voice in Washington.

- For more than 80 years, NRECA has delivered results in Washington as the respected voice of America's electric cooperatives. Its bipartisan reputation is impeccable.
- NRECA is uniquely positioned to represent us and offers specialized staff providing direct input and feedback to the federal policymakers and agencies we need to engage with in this space.

NRECA Broadband – Key Benefits

Advocacy – examples of what NRECA Broadband has been doing.

- NRECA, in partnership with NRTC, submitted a bulk challenge to the FCC's national broadband map. NRECA challenged 266,479 locations in six states on behalf of our members.
- NRECA is communicating our needs to Congress, including:
 - the need for Congress to prioritize networks and technologies that can deliver speeds at or above 100/100 Mbps.
 - the need for accurate national broadband maps.
 - the importance of flexibility in federal programs, especially for small providers such as cooperatives.
 - the importance of maintaining the co-op pole attachment exemption.
 - the need for additional middle mile network funding.
- NRECA has communicated and advocated for NTIA to implement policies that would benefit cooperatives, including:
 - The need to provide states flexibility on what data can determine unserved and underserved areas and to not water down definitions of those areas.
 - The need for flexibility to allow co-ops to address ongoing workforce challenges and shortages of domestically produced equipment and materials.

Networking and education at NRECA events and complimentary director training.

- The exclusive NRECA Broadband Leadership Summit provides unique access to high-level representatives from all federal agencies (FCC, Treasury, USDA, NTIA) that are determining the future of broadband. It also provides opportunities for personal conversations, idea sharing and relationship building.
